March Program: "Birds and wildlife of the The Willits Bypass Mitigation Lands"

Marisela De Santa Anna, Project Interpreter, Willits Bypass Mitigation Lands

Located in Little Lake Valley, the Willits Bypass Mitigation Lands is the largest public wetlands restoration and mitigation project in California. Marisela De Santa Anna will Zoom us around this beautiful land.

Marisela has lived in Willits for 36 years and spent 18 of those years working as a teacher in the Willits Unified School District. She holds a degree in both biology and botany, is an active member in the Audubon Society, California Native Plant Society, and has close ties to the Willits Environmental Center. She has been involved with teaching environmental education and has led bird and wildflower hikes to thousands of kids over the years. Saturday, March 18, 2023 Huichica Creek Larry Kent 8:00 am - 12:00 pm Huichica Creek is a unit of the Napa-Sonoma Wildlife Area in Napa County on the border with Sonoma County. It hosts an abundance of water fowl and shorebirds. We will be led by Larry Kent, one of the top birders in Napa County and one who knows this location well.

We will meet at the parking lot at Huichica Creek at the end of Buchli Station Road (38.2147295, -122.3318977). Drive past Hudeman Slough on Ramal Road. Once in Napa County, turn right on Las Amigas Road, then right on Buchli Station Road, continue until just past the railroad tracks.

*Feb-March is a good time to go owling. They're calling a lot then, setting up territories and seducing each other, but domestic bliss mostly comes later. Laying-incubating-FYfledging comes generally earlier than most other families of birds. Sonoma BBA included 3/15-7/15 and 1/1-7/1 for Screech and Great Horned, respectively, breeding. Early fledgling dates were reported from Mar (Courtship) - Apr (Breeding) for 4 species and late fledgling dates - Aug (Attending Young).

All that indicates "breeding season" from Jan-early Aug. To make matters worse, Barns will do it at any time of year given good conditions, but mostly in the spring.

March-July sounds best. (*ref: P. Colasanti)

Birds of a Feather Flock Together: Short Bios of Birders By BJ Blanchard

Bob Hasenick

Every new birder who discovers Bob Hasenick on the trail hauling pounds of equipment, including a mysterious-looking plastic parabola, might think "what the heck?" and guietly ask others on the trail what he's all about.

In addition to cameras and binoculars, Bob trundles recording equipment around his waist, and lugs the outer-space-like parabola: a large concave disc designed to capture faint scattered sounds like bird calls, and draw those to the center microphone. Turns out that Bob, a retired electronics guy who "loves to tinker", has taken on the task of recording as many bird vocalizations as he can



and uploading them to eBird online. Bob and his wife Carol attended a workshop in 2018 at Cornell University in upstate New York where eBird is managed. At the workshop, Bob learned to record bird discourse – songs, calls, chips, local vernaculars - and he is now Sonoma County's premier recorder of bird vocalisms.

The quiet, self-effacing Bob Hasenick is a Michigan boy originally, having been raised on a dairy farm owned by his father and uncle. Bob knew early that he wanted to be an engineer rather than milk the herd. So, after high school at Springport High School, he attended the Naval Academy for two years before entering Michigan Tech to complete his engineer studies. Work led him to a long career at Hewlett-Packard in California, and it was here, on a kayaking trip with the Loma Prieta Paddlers, that he met Carol, his birding buddy and wife of many years now.

Birding was initially Carol's interest, but avian activity soon enticed Bob as well, and now they bird the world together. Their daughter Kendra inherited the "birding bug" and, when based in Colombia as a Peace Corps volunteer, became involved with Colombian birding organizations. Hence, Bob and Carol were introduced to South American birding – Ecuador, Brazil, Chile, Argentina, Panama, Peru, and Colombia - and may soon bird in Spain if Kendra decides to settle there for a while.

In addition to birding, Bob is also a runner, hiker, cyclist (he doesn't bird while cycling!), and much more.

We've learned from RROS presentations that Bob is a photographer: his photos have been both front cover, front piece and main page of 3 Audubon Engagement calendars. In addition, his photos have won Best of Wildlife for Sierra Magazine, Best of Show at 3 county fairs AND he was a finalist in 2016 for National Geographic Birds of a Feather!!

Ask Bob about his recording equipment. He's always happy to explain.
