Early morning owling along the entrance road to Sugar Loaf Ridge State Park. Possible Spotted Owl and Saw-whet Owl. Probable Northern Pygmy-Owl, Western Screech-Owl, and Great Horned Owl. Ruthie Rudesill will lead us. Ruthie has some of the best "bird ears" in the County and great knowledge of owl calls. We'll meet on Adobe Canyon Road near the intersection with Highway 12 (38.4251438, -122.5559084) at 5:45AM. Owling is about hearing the birds, so please wear quiet clothing—nothing that makes noise when you move. Carpooling is encouraged. After sunrise (7:15AM), those who wish to, may join us birding the Meadow/Hillside trails loop. Sugarloaf requires a \$10 parking fee (\$8 senior) or annual pass.

Sonoma County is a great place to bird. However, summer, here, is pretty slow. The spring migrants have flown through, the winter residents have been replaced by their summer counterparts. And that's it.

A few years ago, finding not much to look for, I looked around Sonoma Valley, where I live, to see if there was some place interesting I could bird. I noticed Ernie Smith Park. This is a suburban park and eBird hotspot which I had driven by a thousand times. At the time, it had exactly one eBird list associated with it, and, that list was incomplete. Total of nine species. Clearly this was a hot spot in need of some birding love. So, I decided to take this on as a personal project. I decided to try to bird this park once a week to see what was there. I've pretty much lived up to that. Not only did I discover new birds for the park, but I discovered that finding a new bird some place no one else has seen it is exhilarating. I still chase rare birds, but a local bird in a new place is almost as good. Hopefully, that rush can encourage people to go out and document the distribution of our birds.

Today I saw Killdeers flying over-the 58th species for the park.
